United Community School House



United Community School House (UCSH), a branch of United Community Builders, provides child development programming for pre-kindergarten to fifth grade students. UCSH uses the HighScope curriculum which "emphasizes 'active participatory learning.' Active learning means students have direct, hands-on experiences with people, objects, events, and ideas" (https://highscope.org/faq). UCSH offers full and half-day sessions Monday through Friday 7 am to 5:30 pm, including a before and after school program. The curriculum provides a sequence of learning objectives that prepare each child for kindergarten readiness. In addition, UCSH provides elementary school participants with homework assistance, fun physical activities, and instructional learning in math, reading, and science. As soon as the kitchen is fully renovated, students will also participate in cooking classes, teaching them basic life skills. It is UCSH's goal to develop a love of learning in each child and to provide the foundations for their future academic success.

United Community Builders (UCB) is a nonprofit faith-based organization that primarily serves the Boone County and Central Missouri region. Founded in 2009, UCB's mission is to build and release capable people through community-wide programs that focus on education, mentorships, job-readiness training and the performing arts. By building the confidence, the gifts and the talents of members to be used in their own community, UCB helps individuals access the power needed to transform their mindsets and behaviors and achieve their own life goals. UCB accomplishes its mission to meet the needs of the community through several initiatives: Community Meal (free, professionally catered, and nutritious meals), Focus on Fatherhood (Fatherhood Initiative Project), Club Kid Connect Youth Academy (summer youth programming), United Community School House (child development center), Transformation (job readiness training program) and Weekend With The Boys (a mentoring program for young males). In eleven years, UCB has provided services to nearly 3,800 people. For more information, visit ucbuilders.org.

Long an advocate for quality musical arts in the community, Emily Edgington Andrews is extremely active in Columbia, working with children and adults at every level of their musical development.

Emily is a third-year Ph.D. candidate in music education at the University of Missouri, where she conducts the MU Women's Choir, co-conducts Concert Chorale, and teaches various courses in music. In addition to her work at MU, she is the Artistic Director and a Conductor for Choral Arts Alliance of Missouri, an organization that offers exceptional choral experiences accessible to everyone from youth

to adults. She serves as the Assistant Conductor for the professional chamber vocal ensemble, Prometheus: An American Vocal Consort. Emily is in her thirteenth year as one of the vocal music teachers at Columbia Independent School, the city's only non-sectarian college preparatory campus, conducting two of the six ensembles for students in grades 4–12. Additionally, this year marks her fifteenth as conductor at the historic Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Columbia, MO.

Emily regularly serves as a guest clinician and adjudicator, and is an active member of the American Choral Directors Association and the National Association for Music Education. She received her degrees in Music at Truman State University, Kirksville, Missouri (B.A.; M.A.) and at the University of Missouri (M.M.).



DERRICK ENYARD, Drummer

Derrick Enyard is a local musician and private instructor currently living in Moberly, MO with his wife and three children. Originally from Fayette, MO, he started singing in church at the age of four and playing drums at nine. His all-time favorite inspirations are LaMont Walker, Steve Jordan, and Al Green for his stage presence and charisma. Derrick can be heard on Audra Sergel's album, Forgotten Songs, and Robin Anderson's album, In All Degrees. Derrick can be seen performing in Columbia and surrounding

areas. Outside of music, Derrick enjoys teaching private lessons, playing sports, kayaking, painting, and drawing portraits.

AMANDA FURTICK, Columbia Kids Gospel Choir Pianist

Amanda Furtick is a University of Missouri graduate, where she studied Vocal Music Education with a concentration in piano. As an undergraduate, she was heavily involved in several collegiate choirs and operas, accompanied the MU Women's Choir and several vocalists, and taught private piano/voice lessons to students in grades K-12.

She is currently the choir director at North Callaway Middle School and High School and

contemporary worship leader at Community United Methodist Church. In addition to teaching and accompanying, Amanda has also vocally directed with TRYPS, a local theatre troupe, and has enjoyed various performing opportunities as a soprano, such as the Southside Philharmonic Orchestra's early baroque program and the Bach Collegium Choir.

As someone who developed her passion for music in early middle school, Amanda is an advocate for using music as an outlet and safe space during a time when students are figuring out who they are.

NATHAN FRATZKE, Guest Conductor

A native of Wilton, Iowa, Nathan Fratzke is currently pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Choral Music at the USC Thornton School of Music, where he has served as Teaching Assistant and Assistant Conductor for both the USC Chamber Singers and USC Concert Choir, as well as Winter Gala Coordinator and Editor for the department newsletter. In addition to his work at USC Thornton. Nathan serves as the director of the choir and contemporary instrumental ensemble at First Unitarian Church of Los Angeles, as well as assistant conductor/ pianist for the Los Angeles Zimriyah Chorale, an auditioned ensemble specializing in the performance of Jewish choral music. Prior to his arrival at USC



Thornton, Nathan was active as a conductor in Columbia, Missouri, where he also earned a Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting at the University of Missouri. While at MU, he taught courses in music theory and directed the Mizzou Men's Glee, MU Summer Singers, Concert Chorale, and University Philharmonic, while also working with the University Singers. Outside of his work at the university, Nathan served as assistant conductor of the Columbia Chorale, conductor of the Columbia Chamber Choir, and Director of Music at Calvary Episcopal Church, where he conducted an adult choir, children's choir, and handbell choir. He completed his undergraduate studies at Wartburg College, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music. In addition to his work as a classical musician, Nathan works as a pianist, guitarist, and freelance artist in the Los Angeles area.

ANTHONY HERNANDEZ, Columbia Chorale Pianist

Anthony Hernandez is a collaborative pianist, organist, composer and teacher who earned his Bachelor of Music in Music Composition from the University of Missouri-Columbia in 2009.

He has worked as music director, rehearsal accompanist, assistant music director and/or pit keyboardist for over 20 musical productions, including Jesus Christ Superstar, Into the Woods, and The Wizard of Oz, with numerous production companies, including Lyceum Arrow Rock Theatre, University of Missouri Theatre Department, Columbia Entertainment Company, and PACE Children's Theatre, among others. He has performed extensively as a collaborative and solo



pianist throughout Missouri, the Midwest, southern California, and in Brasília, Brazil. As a composer, he premiered orchestral works with the Columbia Civic Orchestra and the 9th Street Philharmonic Orchestra and continues to compose new works, including a piano concerto at the Strange New Worlds Part Four exhibition at Talking Horse Productions.

Hernandez was accompanist for the Quorus (Columbia's premier LGBTQQA-Z community chorus) since its founding in November 2016 and regular onstaff collaborative pianist for Stephens College of the Performing Arts and Columbia College of Missouri. He was ballet accompanist with Columbia Performing Arts Center, playing for their summer intensive programs 2015 to 2018. He served as pianist and organist at First Church of Christ, Scientist of Columbia 2012 to 2018 and at Missouri United Methodist Church for 11 years. Hernandez also has maintained a full piano studio, teaching students of all ages in all styles of music from pop and rock to classical, musical theatre, and jazz.

In the summer of 2018, Hernandez moved to Los Angeles, CA, where he was piano and beginning violin instructor at Sunset Learning Studio in Manhattan Beach. He provided service music for the Twentieth Church of Christ, Scientist in Venice on Sunday mornings and was piano accompanist for the Culver City Middle School choirs, and was a regular ballet pianist at the Pasadena Dance Theatre. Due to the global pandemic, he returned to St. Louis, where he taught lessons virtually and has also returned to his alma mater to pursue graduate studies in Collaborative Piano.

WILL LYONS, Gospel Choir Keyboardist

Will Lyons is a St. Louis native but has spent over 10 years in Columbia, Missouri serving his community both physically, as a local firefighter in Columbia for four years, and spiritually, as a musician and preacher among many churches and organizations. Lyons is an accomplished musician, being able to play a wide variety of instruments, who currently plays drums for Community United Methodist Church as well as the organ and piano for Log Providence Missionary Baptist Church. Lyons is the present Music Director for Mt. Carmel Missionary Baptist District and has notably recorded tracks with the University of Missouri Concert Jazz Band. Nollie Moore is the director of the Music Program and an instructor of voice at Columbia College in Columbia, MO, where he directs the highly selective campus chamber choir, the Jane Froman Singers, as well as the newly formed campus show choir.

He is the faculty advisor to the college A Cappella Society and the campus drama club, The Elysium Players. His singers can be heard on two professional compact disc recordings: *Simply American*, a compilation of performances from the group's many

international tours, and *Peace*, a full-length disc containing several of the works performed by the group at the annual home campus Holiday Lighting Festival. Concert tours have taken members to New York City's Carnegie Hall; the great Cathedrals of Scotland, England, Austria, Italy, and Ireland; and the state of the art concert halls of the Republic of China.

Moore is active as a professional tenor singing regularly throughout the Midwest and abroad. Moore most recently sang the tenor solos for Handel's *Messiah* in Dublin and London to critical acclaim. Moore's professional regional musical theater work includes *The Music Man*, *Forever Plaid* and *Fiddler on the Roof*.

Moore has served or is currently serving on the board of directors for the Columbia College Alumni Association, Theater Reaching Young People in Schools, the Columbia Civic Orchestra, and the Missouri Symphony Society. Moore serves as director of Traditional Music at Broadway Christian Church.

(University of Missouri), the church choirs of First Presbyterian Church of Columbia and First Presbyterian Church in Fulton, Battle High School Vocal Arts ensembles Siren Sound and Apollo, and University Singers (UM). 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
